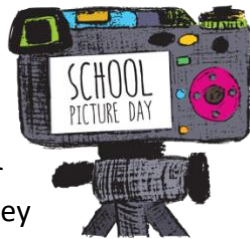
**NATIONAL DAY FOR TRUTH

If at all possible, please do not send food to school containing nuts.



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PARKING LOT SAFETY

Please help keep our students safe by using the drop off zone for picking up and dropping off students only. Please do not leave your car unattended in

the drop off zone; if you need to come into the school, please park in a designated parking space. When walking to school, please use the designated paths south and adjacent to the driveway as you enter the school grounds. Please follow arrows to keep our students safe and keep our parking lot accident free.

Please remember the east parking lot is for school and construction staff only. Please do not park or drop off children in this area.

STUDENT AFFORDABILITY FUND

Recently, the provincial government announced a new, one time [Student and Family Affordability Fund](#). This fund is designed to assist families who require financial assistance with school-related costs such as school and course fees, workbooks, specialty supplies, field trips and other school-related charges and costs. The additional funding will also be used to support school meal programs and other nutritional supports for students.



EMERGENCY DRILLS

Frequently throughout the year our staff and students practice emergency drills.

These include fire, earthquake, and hold and secure drills. We recently completed our first fire/evacuation drill. Our Wolfpack did a great job leaving the school calmly and quietly. Classes exit through their common doors and muster on the field.
