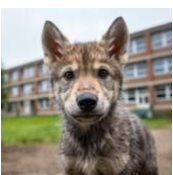
FROM OUR WHITESIDE WOLVES:

All families should be aware that Whiteside School has many students with severe, life-threatening food allergies. Some classrooms may be designated nut free to protect the health of these students. Please help us limit the nut products entering our school overall, as the impact on a student can happen anywhere in the school. If possible, please do not send food to school containing nuts.

LATE FRENCH IMMERSION REGISTRATION

As you may be aware, the Richmond School District offers full time, Late French Immersion programs beginning at Grade 6 at James Whiteside and John Diefenbaker Elementary schools. The Late French Immersion program is a unique District program designed for 10- and 11-year-old students who have completed grade 5, who do not speak French, but who are interested in becoming functionally bilingual (French and English). In grade 6, 100% of the BC curriculum is taught with an emphasis on students acquiring French language skills: reading, writing and speaking. Students in this program do not receive English Language Learner (ELL) support in grade 6. In grade 7, English Language Arts are reintroduced while other subjects continue to be taught in French.

DIGITAL DEVICE POLICY

In January 2024, the Ministry of Education and Child Care mandated all school boards in British Columbia to update their Codes of Conduct to include restrictions on students' personal digital device use.

Students should not have personal digital devices (phones, tablets, smart watches, or computers) in their possession during the school day unless permission is granted by the supervising staff for educational purposes. This includes during recess and lunch or while outside on the playground or on school property. It is recommended that students do not bring personal digital devices to school.
